Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need
Competitions – Increasing numbers of children participating in competitions and increased success in competitions has a positive impact on children’s self-esteem. Swimming – Focus on children not achieving 25m. More children are now leaving school at standard and with an essential life skill. Equipment – School now has more up to date equipment across a wider range of sports. Children use equipment of a similar standard to that used in competitions. Staff Skills – Regular reviews of staff skills and gaps are carried out and the school has plans in place to fill these gaps. Outside Fitness Equipment – School now has a wider range of outdoor fitness opportunities in Nursery, reception, KS1 and KS2.	Swimming – Top up swimming in Year 6 to ensure more children reaching the target of at least 25m. Staff skills – Inset training for staff to ensure a good spread of skills across the staff. Sportsmanship – continue this programme to have a positive impact on children’s behaviour both in and out of school. Sporting Clubs – to expand the provision of sporting clubs to ensure equality of opportunity for children to participate. Outside Fitness Equipment – continue to provide fitness equipment so all children have access at playtimes to equipment that encourages fitness and expand the provision for KS2.
