Terms of Reference for Standards Committee

- Quorum** The quorum shall be three non-staff governors.
- Meetings** The committee shall meet at least once per term and otherwise as necessary

Membership This shall consist of not fewer than four governors (who are not disqualified by having an interest requiring them to withdraw) and such other members as the governing body may appoint.

The committee shall have delegated powers for all decisions regarding the curriculum and its impact on standards at Malmesbury Primary School, though it may refer decisions to the full governing body when the committee deems it to be appropriate

The committee shall have such co-opted, non-voting members as the governing body shall appoint. The committee may make recommendations for these appointments.

Chair of committee to be elected annually in the Autumn Term.
Terms of reference to be reviewed annually in the Autumn Term.

Function

The Standards committee shall have responsibility for monitoring the school's curriculum and policies on behalf of the full governing body and ensuring statutory obligations are met by:

- maintaining an overview of the curriculum (Intent, Implementation and Impact)
- reviewing the information on pupil performance (national, local and school data) and making recommendations to the governing body on areas for development
- considering the attainment and progress of different pupil groups
- reviewing feedback from teaching monitoring processes carried out by the Senior Leadership Team
- monitoring the involvement of children, parents and the community in the life of the school
- monitoring the school's self-evaluation, with particular regard to the views of parents/carers and other stakeholders and to the personal development of and equal opportunities for all the school community
- reviewing and making recommendations on the promotion of British Values and counteracting radicalism
- contributing to the school development plan

Sept 2025

- agreeing and recommending the policies for the provision of sex education, religious education and collective worship
- agreeing annually the policy for special educational needs and ensuring that the appropriate information is in the school website
- agreeing and recommending all other relevant school policies ensuring timely and robust review
- monitoring the impact of educational visits
