

English

As readers, we will read and discuss an increasing range of fiction and poetry. We will make comparisons within and across books, make predictions and infer information about a character's thoughts and feelings.

As writers, we will gain a deeper awareness of our audience and styles of writing. We will develop more control over the construction of our paragraphs.

Science

As scientists, we will compare and group together everyday materials on the basis of their properties, including their hardness, solubility, transparency, conductivity (electrical and thermal) and response to magnets. We will use our knowledge to carry out investigations on this topic.

Geography

As geographers, we will learn about energy. We will find out what energy is, where it comes from and how we use it.

Computing

As computer scientists, we will be learning about computer systems and safe ways to share information.

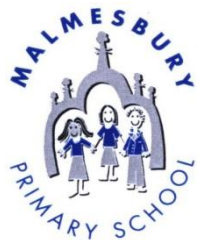
Art

Maths

As mathematicians, we will be focusing on place value including reading, writing and comparing numbers up to 1,000,000. We will then look at adding and subtracting 4 digit numbers including using mental strategies before moving onto multi-step problems and missing number calculations.
